FEARING MASS PROTESTS, GOV. WALKER CANCELS WICHITA VISIT

Kansans say "NO" to Walker's radical brand of politics. In the wake of mass protests of his attacks on working families in his home state, Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker has cancelled a high-priced Wichita fundraiser with Governor Brownback and RNC Chair Reince Priebus. Thousands of Kansas workers led by the Wichita/Hutchinson Labor Federation and the Working

Kansas Alliance had planned to protest Walker's policies and his appearance at the fundraiser. Several busses full of protestors, including KNEA members and pro-education supporters, were set to arrive in Wichita from all corners of the state. [More](#)
