

# PROSSER & WALKER

## A HISTORY OF COLLABORATING TO OPPOSE WORKERS

- Justice David Prosser has publicly signaled he will support Walker. His campaign said he wants to “complement” Walker and the Legislature, and he recently said he does not want to obstruct them.

- Walker and Prosser were allies in the Legislature. They voted the same way 95% of the time, and those votes were consistently in favor of big corporations and against middle class workers. For example, they both voted for a bill that took school employees out of the discussion over the school calendar.

- As a member of the Supreme Court, Prosser has continued his record of voting against education and working people. He has denied the existence of a fundamental constitutional right for kids to have an equal opportunity for a sound basic education, supported privatizing public sector work, permitted public workers to be disciplined without a just cause hearing, denied workers jury trials in family medical leave cases, and sanctioned discrimination against disabled workers.

WEAC members have recommended JoAnne Kloppenburg for Wisconsin Supreme Court. Kloppenburg is an Assistant Attorney General who has been a prosecutor and litigator at the Wisconsin Department of Justice since 1989, arguing cases before the Supreme Court and in courts around the state. She has served Attorneys General from both parties with distinction.

In contrast to Prosser, Kloppenburg will bring an impartial perspective to the court and decide cases based on the merits. She will be open to the views of all people, not just corporations and the wealthy.
